## I N T R O D U C T I O N

In the 7th century there was in all probability a Saxon wooden church here. The massive Norman stone church that was known to exist in 1130 was rebuilt and enlarged in the early form of the Decorated period between 1250 and 1258. A general rebuilding, in the Perpendicular style, was begun in about 1450. The spire, however, is more modern, for it was built, and the upper part of the tower was renewed, in 1832. In the past fifteen years extensive repairs have been carried out to the clerestory, nave roof, tower and spire.

In the churchyard the oldest tomb is dated 1667 (no. 140) and continue to 1881 (no. 183), with an additional one of 1982 (no. 229).


On the floor of the church there are two chest tombs, dated 1521 (no. C6) and 1544 (no. C14). Of the ledger stones, the oldest is 1672 (no. C48) and the latest 1844 (no. C26).

On the walls of the church monuments and records run from 1568 (no. C98) to 1952 (no. C140), but there is a brass of 1430 (no. C87). The list of Vicars goes back to c. 1200.




CHURCH of ST. MARY THE VIRGIN • SAFFRON WALDEN • ESSEX


CHURCH of ST. MARY THE VIRGIN • SAFFRON WALDEN • ESSEX


CHURCH of ST. MARY THE VIRGIN • SAFFRON WALDEN • ESSEX





 CHURCHYARD - CENTRE SECTION and CHURCH - WEST END



Viscount Maynard being appointed Lieutenant of the Division./The following is an extract from the Chelmsford Chronicle of June 8th 1804, giving an account of it./The Division included a detachment from Saffron Walden, giving the names of the Officers of that Division/as under:-/MAJOR COMMANDING THOMAS HALL August 10th 1803/CAPTAIN MARTIN KNOCKNOLDS do 10th 1803/LIEUTENANT WILLIAM ROBINSON do 12th 1803/do. THOMAS EDWARDS do 12th 1803/ENSIGN JAMES SEARLE August 10th 1803/do. SAMUEL FISKE do 10th 1803/SURGEON SAMUEL FISKE DECEMBER 1st 1803/ ESSEX VOLUNTEERS, 1807/On Monday morning last, the 2nd Battalion of the First Essex Legion of Volunteers was marched into Danbury Park, to attend the Consecration of the Colours and afterwards to receive the presentation of them. The whole, consisting of 1,100 men, were on the ground in various detachments by eleven o'clock, and after halting in the shade for about an hour, after so long a march, the whole formed into line about noon, with their troop of cavalry on the right. The Cambridge Regiment of Militia at this time marched into the Park, and also a squadron of Lord Paget's Light Dragoons to keep the ground. The Legion then formed three sides of a square when the Colours for each Battalion and the Standard for the Cavalry, being brought under escort, and placed in the centre, they were consecrated by the Rev. H. B. Dudley, First Chaplain to the Legion, who, delivering them successively into the hands of Mrs. Hillary, she presented them to Colonel Hillary, thus addressing him:- "With the greatest satisfaction, Sir, I present through you, these Colours and Standard to the First Essex Legion. I have the fullest confidence that they will be received by that Corps as a bond of

their union, and at all times be gallantly defended by their valour." Colonel Hillary replied:- "Madam, I return you the best acknowledgements in the name of the Legion, for the honour you have conferred upon us. From the experience I have had of their zeal and attachment to the cause in which they have embarked I rest assured, that you will not be disappointed in the expectations which you have formed of their exemplary conduct." The Colours and Standard were then trooped to the line and were received under presented arms, the band playing "God Save the King". This interesting ceremonial was performed in the presence of Major-General Beckwith, Hon. Major-General Finch, Colonel Watson, the Inspecting Officer of the District; the Field Officers of the Guards and other Corps in the District and the principal Ladies and Gentlemen of the County. The Legion now formed into companies, and passed the General in review in open order, afterwards they fired three volleys in honour of the day. Colonel Hillary was deservedly complimented by the General for the steadiness of this fine body of men under arms; the general appearance of this Volunteer line was much heightened by their soldier-like uniform, both Battalions and Cavalry being in the best military style. -----

These colours were recently handed over to Major Herbert Taylor, commanding the Saffron Walden Detachment ("I" Company) of the 3rd (Cams) Volunteer Battalion, Suffolk Regiment, and placed by him in the Parish Church of Saffron Walden, on the 21st of June 1887, being the Jubilee Year of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria.

Saint Mary the Virgin Saffron Walden in Com Essex was one of those which upon the founding of the Monastery were given to it by Geffery de Mandeville the founder as part of their endowment, wherein Reginald the first Abbot, as he did in several others, instituted a Vicar, but in process of time, thro a/great Mortality (Sudbury 116) which twice happened, the Abbot and Convent losing many of their Servants and tenants, whereby their lands lay untilled and by an unusual tempest of wind their buildings, particularly their Conventual Church being much ruined, that they were not able to/repair it and undergo other necessary Burthens incumbent upon them, they petition'd Simon Sudbury, then Bishop of London, to reunite and annex to their Abbey for ever, that portion which upon Appropriating of the said Parish Church to the said Abbey was set apart and reserved to the/Vicar of the same and his Successors, to the end it might Be applied to the reparation of their Conventual Church, and they to provide a Secular Priest at their own costs and charges to supply the Cure; upon which the said Bishop granted his commission, dated 8. Kal Nov<sup>r</sup> 1365 to Walter/de Aldersbury and William de Coloyne, Canons of the Cathedral Church of S<sup>t</sup> Paul, to enquire into the premises, and if they found them true, to reunite the said portion of the Vicar to the said Abbey and Convent according to their desire. And the said Commissioners finding what/was alleged to be true, accordingly did, and the said Bishop Feb 1, and the Dean & Chapter of S<sup>t</sup> Pauls, Feb 2, confirmed the same under their respective Seals. But notwithstanding all this, some years after, here was a Vicarage again established and Vicars successfully instituted etc.-/ from 1435 to this very time, the Patronage whereof, was in the said Abbey and Convent till, the surrender thereof on 1537 on March 22

29 Hen. VIII

by William Moore, Suff<sup>r</sup> Bp of Colchester, holding it then in Commendam; for a Clerk was admitted in Septem<sup>r</sup> before, at the Presentation of/the said William Moore, commendatory of the Monastery of Walden who became Vicar himself, after the said surrender. But soon after, the Advow<sup>n</sup> was in the Lord Audley, by the aforesaid Grant to the Abbey, then in his widow, and after her decease, in-/Thomas Duke of Norfolk, who marry'd his Daughter and Heir and thence descended to the Noble family of Suffolk, in which family it still remains. After the reestablishment of this Vicarage there was a Composition 1444 between the Abbott & Con<sup>v</sup>t of Walden, and John/Tythmerch, Vicar, whereby was settled such Tyths as the Abbot & Con<sup>v</sup>t should have and such as the Vicar should receive for the future, as followeth./ Be it knowyn to all Christian Peppyl That where stryf and Discord was had between the Abb<sup>t</sup> & Convent of the Monasterie of Walden on the oo partie and the Vicary of the said Town of Walden on that other Partie, because of an Accon (=Action)moyvd/in the Spiritual Law for certain Tythes and also betweene the said Abbot and Convent and certain Parishyshenys of the said Town of Walden bycause withdrawing of Tythes. Necessary it is Pees (=Peace) & Unitie to be had:- the said Abbot Convent & Vicary/by our Advice & Assent with good Mediacon and Menys of the said Parish have entreated effectually to accord.
