As you know we have a mission to fulfil the duty that is ours of preserving this Church in all its beauty for those who come after and this year we have donated to a major project, the largest amount in any one donation since we were formed back in 1933.

Recent Projects completed

Welcome Furniture

Our largest contribution this last year was almost £30,000 towards the major Building Project taking place in the Church and that money paid for all the Welcome Furniture and the North Aisle magazine cupboard. The Welcome furniture can be seen as soon as you enter the West Door and is quite magnificent. This is the highest amount the Friends have contributed to any single project in their history and for that we are very proud. We are sure that you will agree it was money well spent as the furniture has been so beautifully crafted and is proving to be a great asset to the Church.

Future Projects

Discussion of plans for the *Muniments Room* have commenced although work will not be considered until after the current Building Project is completed. The Friends have expressed an interest in contributing in some way once more detail is available.

Work on the re-siting of the *Audley Tomb* is a future project and will not take place until after the Major Building Project is complete but the Friends will contribute towards the costs.

Plans for a stand for the new *Friends Banner* are still in hand and we hope to have this completed in this coming year.

In the long term we are still holding funds to contribute to a **new lighting scheme** once it commences- date as yet unknown.

Ongoing Projects

Kneelers. It was the Rev. Peter Harlow, 40 years ago, whose idea it was that we needed a touch of colour in the Church. He suggested banners and kneelers and for anyone who was interested to come to a meeting at the Rectory and about eight of us assembled.

The advice we were given was to keep to very few colours, the contrast would come from the variety of stitches. Also not to make to make it too easy with large stitches as people only get bored if there is not challenge!

Anyone can donate a kneeler to commemorate a loved one or an occasion and can choose a central design. We charge £40 per kneeler to cover the cost of the canvas and the wool.
