### **Recent Projects completed**

You will have noticed that there are new benches outside the west door of the Church and the Friends have been delighted to sponsor one of them. We hope that they will be regularly used, especially in the summer as all our visitors have the opportunity to sit and admire our magnificent Church.



## 'St Mary's Saffron Walden, A History & Guide'

This new book has sold so well during its first year that we have organised a re-print especially in light of the fact that we are expecting many visitors to the Flower Festival in August. Selling at £5 the book offers huge knowledge of the Church to visitors and to us all as well as providing funds for the Friends to continue their work in our Church.



## Future Projects

- The Friends will be funding **New Carpets** which will appear either side of the Nave making this a much tidier area which I am sure you will agree will make a great improvement
- Discussion of plans for the **Muniments Room** have commenced although work will not be considered until after current, in hand building projects are completed. The Friends have expressed an interest in contributing in some way once more detail is available.
- Work on the re-siting of the **Audley Tomb**. The Friends will contribute to the cost of this major project which we hope to see started this year. It will be such a delight to have the Tomb available for all to see in the north aisle and be a useful educational tour especially for visiting children.
- A new site has been agreed for the **Friends Banner** and work will commence on the new stand this year in order to display this beautiful work of art in all its glory. The new site is in the Remembrance Chapel area where there are already several items donated by the Friends.
- In the long term we are still holding funds to contribute to a **New Lighting Scheme** once it commences- date as yet unknown.

## **Ongoing Projects**

**Kneelers.** Anyone can donate a kneeler to commemorate a loved one or an occasion and can choose a central design. We charge £40 per kneeler to cover the cost of the canvas and the wool.
