REFLECTIONS

In the Free Church tradition in which I grew up every service of divine worship contained a psalm. In several of the "Common worship" orders of service of the Church of England psalms are either optional or not included. But the book of Psalms has been for centuries the primary resource for the devotional life of the people of God. Its "varied and resplendent riches" (Calvin) include magnificent hymns of praise, poignant outpourings of the soul in prayer and earnest professions of the faithful.

I regret the fact that most of our modern services do not include a psalm. The book of Psalms is a book of religious poetry. More exactly lyrical poetry. That is to say, poetry which expresses the feelings of the writer, not about anything and everything in general, but-in the case of the psalms - the experience of life drawn out by the unfailing awareness of the divine presence come what may, be it rough or smooth.

For Christians it is important to remember that the fundamental content of Jesus' teaching is essentially the same as the central theological affirmation of the Psalter and also that certain specifics of Jesus' teaching are closely related to the psalms.

I commend to you the use of the psalms in your daily devotions. Why not start with the psalm appointed for today (Psalm 106) which begins; "Praise the Lord! O give thanks to the Lord for he is good: for his steadfast love endures forever."

Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, increase in us your gift of faith that, forsaking what lies behind and reaching out to that which is before, we may run the way of your commandments and win the crown of everlasting joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading: Philippians 4.1-9

My brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved. I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. Yes, and I ask you also, my loyal companion, help these women, for they have struggled beside me in the work of the gospel, together with Clement and the rest of my

co-workers, whose names are in the book of life. Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Gospel: Matthew 22.1-14

Once more Jesus spoke to the chief priests and Pharisees in parables, saying: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves, maltreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet." Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'
