SAFFRON WALDEN AND VILLAGES TEAM MINISTRY PRAYERS FOR SUNDAYS IN ADVENT: 29 NOVEMBER AND 6, 13 AND 20 DECEMBER 2020

This prayer sheet is specially designed for those who are praying at home during this time of Coronavirus. It covers services during Advent, with readings and suggested hymns for each week. Text of the readings will be set out in the Grapevine, which will be sent round each week as usual. We hope that this sheet will continue to connect you to the rhythm of our worship together. You might like to light a candle, symbolising Jesus as the Light of the World: and to say the prayers and readings out loud. Remember that even if you are by yourself at home, you are still part of God's Church, praying across the world.

This season marks the Church's new year. 'Advent' means 'coming', and we prepare ourselves for the coming of Jesus Christ. It is a serious as well as a joyful time, as we look **back** to his first coming as a human child at Christmas, God becoming one of us with all our vulnerability and weakness, and also look **forward** to the time when Christ will come again to make all things new. Many churches use purple vestments and altar frontals for these Sundays.

Introduction

We gather together, united in purpose though separate in place, in the name of God, our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer.

We say together (or why not sing!) an opening hymn: see pages 5-12.

The Lord is here.

His Spirit is with us.

We have come together as the family of God in this community. And especially today we thank you, heavenly Father, for the hope of the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ at Christmas and for the joy and light which he brings to this dark world. Help us to pray to you in faith, to sing your praise with gratitude, and to listen to your word with eagerness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Prayers of Penitence

When the Lord comes, he will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness, and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Therefore in the light of Christ let us confess our sins.

Turn to us again, O God our Saviour, and let your anger cease from us:Lord have mercyLord have mercyShow us your compassion, O Lord, and grant us your salvation:Christ have mercyYour salvation is near for those who fear you, that glory may dwell in our land:Lord have mercyLord have mercy

Hearing God's forgiveness

May almighty God, who sent his Son into the world to save sinners, bring you his pardon and peace, now and for ever. **Amen**.

As God's forgiven people, we say Thanks be to God for his endless grace.

Gospel: St Luke, Chapter 1, verses 26-38

You may like to base your own prayers around the themes below: feel free to expand and to use your own words

Father, we thank you for the promise of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. May we await his coming with faith and with trust, recognising our own sinfulness but trusting always in his saving love. Make us ready to meet him when he comes: and keep alert, watching and waiting for your kingdom. *Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer*

We pray for your Church throughout the world, especially for Christians who face hardship or persecution. We pray for all the people, communities and churches of this Saffron Walden and Villages Team Ministry, and for our Bishops. We thank you for the appointment of our new Team Rector, and pray that you will bless him and his family richly as they prepare to join us. *Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer*

We pray for your world; for all world leaders; and for peace. As we await the coming of your Son, born far from home, we pray for all refugees; all those living without peace or security; all those who are poor or hungry; all who face the coming of Christmas with anxiety. May we act positively to help their need. *Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer*

We pray for all those suffering from COVID-19: all who cannot meet their families or loved ones; all who are uncertain about their future or possible new restrictions. Support all doctors, nurses and carers, and inspire all medical researchers as they work on vaccines. May we all act responsibly for each other. *Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer*

We pray for our communities in town and villages. Bless all who are sick or in any kind of need. Bless our families, friends and neighbours, both near and far, especially those in need of any kind whom we name before you in the silence of our hearts Hold them in your loving arms, and be with them always. *Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer*

In a moment of silence, offer to God any other needs on your heart. Merciful Father, accept these prayers, for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Heavenly Father, sustain us in our joys and in our anxieties. Enfold us in your peace in our waking and in our sleeping, and may we know your presence with us now and always: in the name of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen**.

Christ the Sun of Righteousness shine upon us, scatter the darkness from before our path, and make us ready to meet him when he comes in glory; and may the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit, be with us all now and evermore.
