### Collect

Almighty God, you have broken the tyranny of sin and have sent the Spirit of your Son into our hearts whereby we call you Father: give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service, that we and all creation may be brought to the glorious liberty of the children of God; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

### First Reading: 2 Corinthians 6.1-13

As we work together with Christ, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see – we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything. We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. In return – I speak as to children – open wide your hearts also.

### Gospel: Mark 4.35-41

When evening had come, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us go across to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'

### Post Communion

O God, whose beauty is beyond our imagining and whose power we cannot comprehend: show us your glory as far as we can grasp it, and shield us from knowing more than we can bear until we may look upon you without fear; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.

## REFLECTIONS - JOHN RISBY

It is good to see young children being introduced to water early in their lives. Almost from the start they learn not to fear water and can swim almost before they walk! I am envious as one who only learnt to swim as an adult. At school swimming sessions I used to creep across the pool, walking whilst most were able to swim! Eventually I taught myself to take my feet off the bottom, to learn to float and to swim.....not before time!

Peter and the other disciples had to learn this lesson, too, not only in water on a stormy lake, but also in life. As they spent more time with the Lord, so their faith in him grew, and they overcame their fears. For some of us there is a constant battle going on 'faith v fear' and sometimes we win and sometimes we lose! The Lord encourages us to look to him and his unchanging Word each day, this could be described as 'abiding in him', resting in him and his word.

Hudson Taylor, who headed mission work in China long ago, records in his journal how there came a time when the pressures of leadership and his own soul struggles were threatening to get on top of him, like waves about to engulf him. A letter from a dear friend was used by God to open his eyes to his oneness with Jesus. 'How to get faith strengthened?' this was the burning question. McCarthy had written... 'not by striving after faith, but by resting on the Faithful One.' 'If we believe not, he [Jesus] remains faithful.' [2 Timothy 2.13]. God spoke to Hudson Taylor through those words as he speaks to us when we look at the waves and feel the force of the wind...to turn to Jesus and ask him to help us to trust in him and in the faithfulness of him who said, 'I will never leave you nor forsake you.' [Hebrews 13.5]. I am still learning, spiritually, to take my feet off the bottom, and to trust the one who is, and always will be, my Saviour.

Help us, O Lord, to emulate the psalmist who said, 'when I am afraid I put my trust in the Lord.' \* Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer. Amen.
